  - “High end goal is to change the culture of the campus”



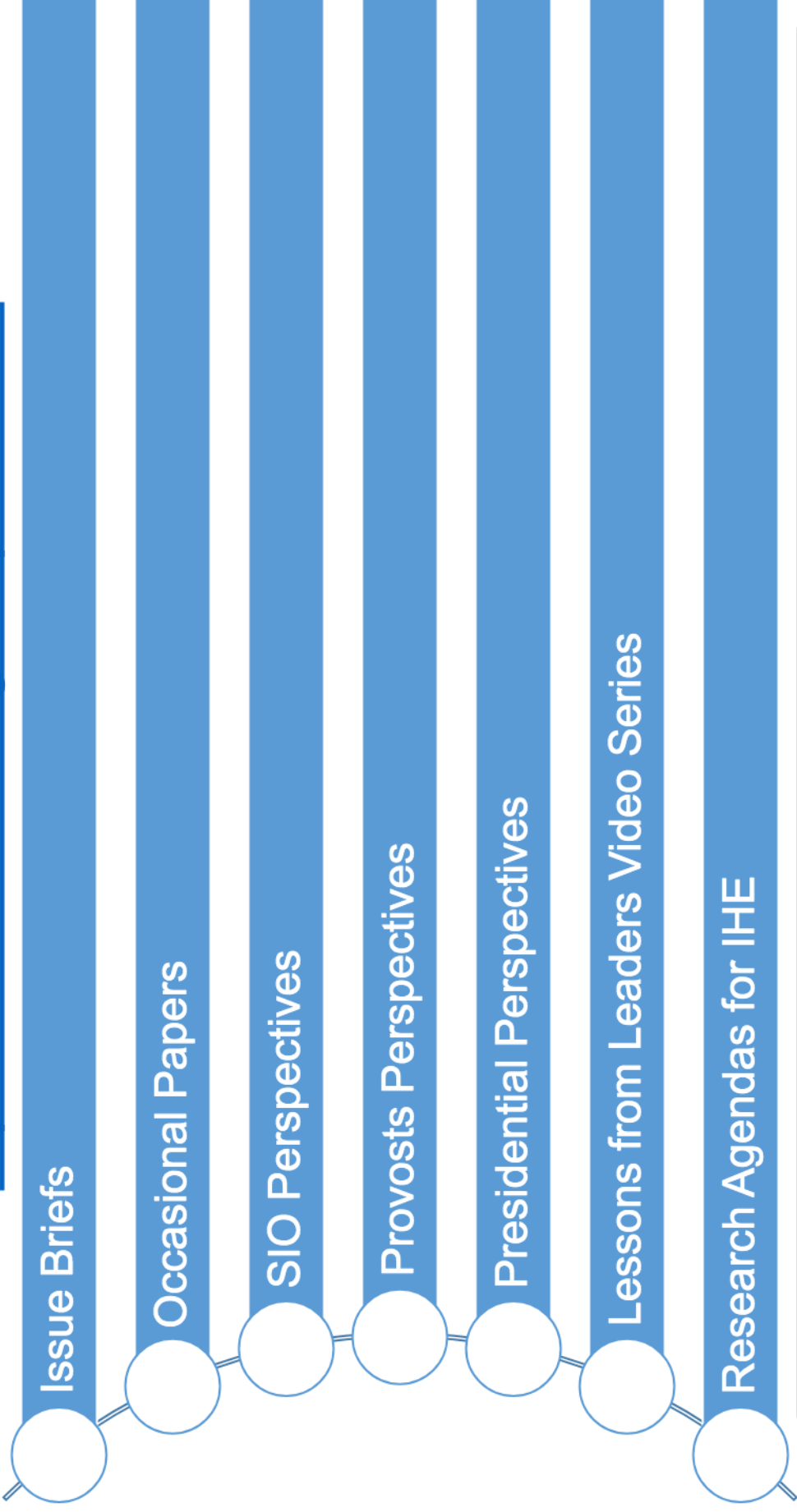
# Association of International Education Administrators

- Seek out co-authors
  - Variety in institutional type and geography
  - Consider U.S. and non-U.S. perspectives
- Consider timely and relevant topics
- Review guiding questions in that series
- Consider SIO audience
  - Lacks time to read lengthy documents
  - Utilizes scholarship to inform practice
  - Utilizes empirical evidence to advocate internationalization with a variety of stakeholders
- Other audience
  - Researchers (likely looking for more in-depth analysis)
  - Faculty & Graduate Students in IHE graduate programs
