The Association of International Education Administrators (AIEA) presented its annual Timothy J. Rutenber Award at an awards luncheon on Tuesday, Feb. 19 in New Orleans, LA during its annual conference. The award, which honors AIEA members who have rendered long-term and outstanding service to the Association, was given to Dr. John D. Heyl, Vice President for Strategic Partnerships at CEA Global Education.

"John has given so much to this organization through his leadership and continued contributions," said AIEA Executive Director Dr. Darla Deardorff. "He is so deserving of this award given his exemplary service to the Association."

Prior to joining CEA Global Education, Dr. Heyl served as Senior International Officer at University of Missouri-Columbia and Old Dominion University (VA). He is a former president of AIEA (2000-2001), author of *The Senior International Officer (SIO) as Change Agent* (AIEA, 2007), and co-editor of *The SAGE Handbook of International Higher Education* (2012). He holds a B.A. from Stanford University and a doctorate in European history from Washington University-St. Louis.

In the words of one of his recommenders for this award, "Through the combination of his sustained leadership, service, passion, wisdom and grace, John Heyl epitomizes the qualities Rutenber held dear."
