- Seek out co-authors
 - Variety in institutional type and geography
 - Consider U.S. and non-U.S. perspectives
- Consider timely and relevant topics
- Review guiding questions in that series
- Consider SIO audience
 - ➤ Lacks time to read lengthy documents
 - Utilizes scholarship to inform practice
 - Utilizes empirical evidence to advocate internationalization with a variety of stakeholders
- Other audience
 - Researchers (likely looking for more in-depth analysis)
 - Faculty & Graduate Students in IHE graduate programs







Ideas & suggestions (Amir)

- Connect with university Public Relations
 - Follow up periodically
 - Share news on publications & upcoming presentations
 - May be called to respond to media inquiry
- Contribute to publications in other higher education organizations (e.g. NASPĂ) which may not have a complete focus on internationalization, but have overlapping interests
- Partner with faculty to conduct research

Pick venues with flexible deadlines


Communicate with publisher/editor


