# Changes in the global research landscape

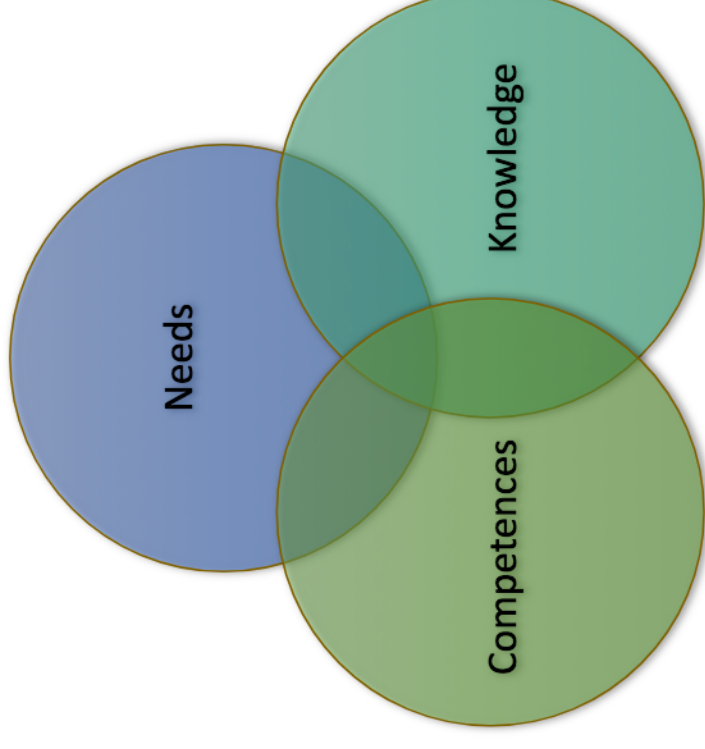
- Globalization, changing power structures, populism and nationalism
- At the same time, global challenges are growing increasingly larger and collaboration across border even more important
- A clear trend is that countries that traditionally have not been known for high quality research are advancing
- Swedish HEIs collaborating with a larger number of countries
- Today we need to relate to larger portfolio of goals and conditions

# Working with guidelines for responsible internationalization

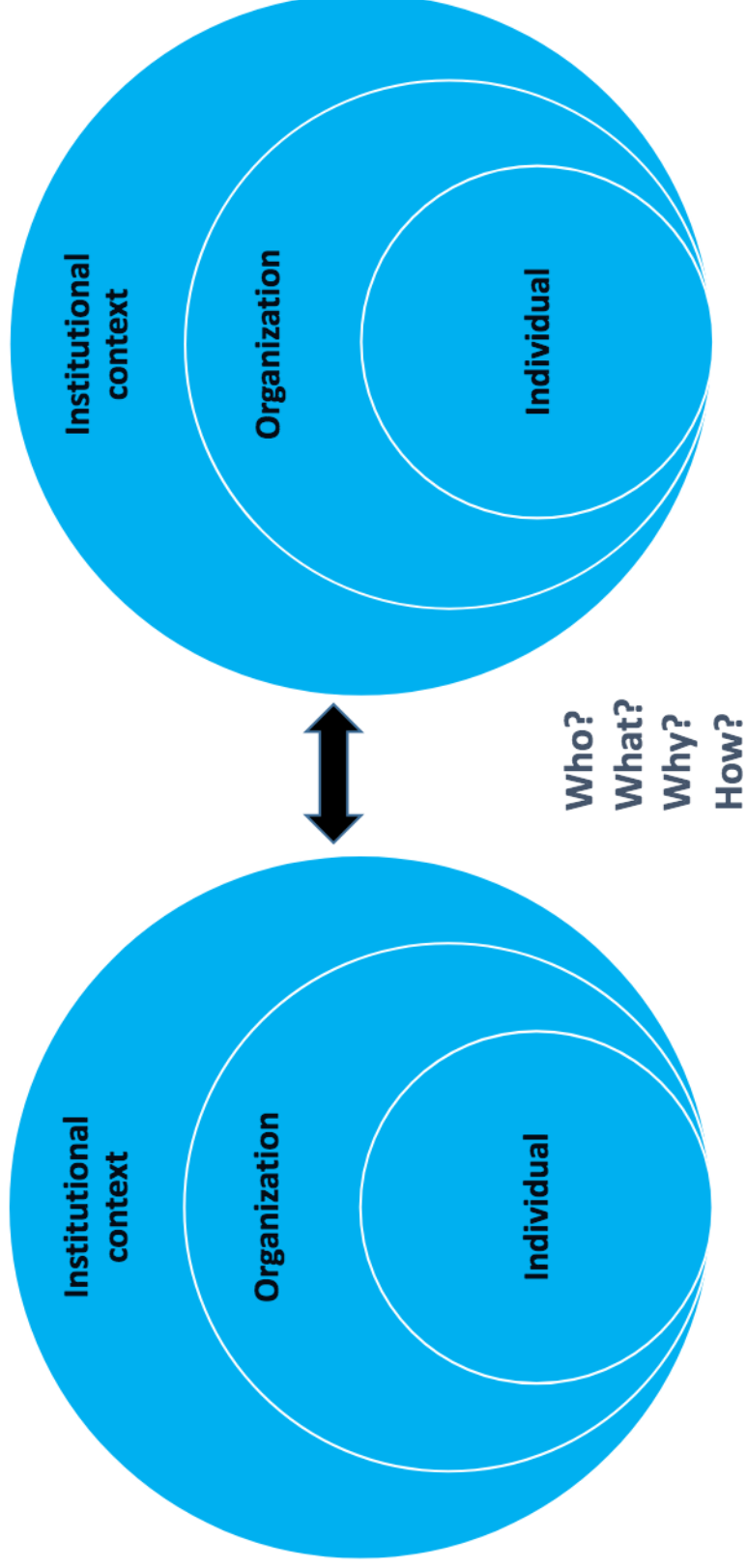
- Broader and more complex goal portfolio to consider
  - Global challenges that require international collaboration
  - Increased friction in the world
- Work across sectors and border essential to improve conditions conducive to solve problems
- Build networks and shared understanding around certain issues pertinent to collaboration
  - Knowledge
  - Leadership

# The process

- Research based
- Questions:
  - What are the needs of the HEIs?
  - How do past/present collaborations look like?
  - How can the HEIs work meaningfully with internationalization in the future?
- Over 200 interviews, reference groups
- Bibliometrics and the follow-up of the STINT's mobility programs
- Close collaboration with HEIs, funding organizations and, government agencies

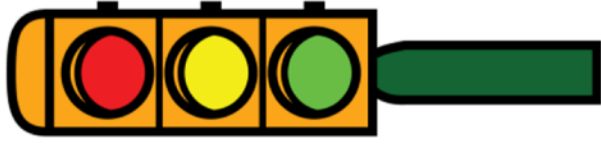
